



Years in the Refugee Camp

This is a memoir of Sr. Chen Liqing, one of the two Taiwanese vocations of the Maryknoll Sisters who served in Tanzania for almost 40 years.

Her story is a testimony of faith that resonates to Pope Francis' encouragement to be "joyful and enthusiastic as a response to the call of sanctification."

Caritas Taiwan in one way or another had helped Sr. Chen Liqing's projects and mission in her years in Tanzania.

International Volunteer Program

Summer Camps are organized each year by Caritas Taiwan in different places in China with the collaboration of some religious priests and nuns in the schools or parishes.

In 2018, the volunteers who are professional teachers in Taiwan divided among themselves the topics and activities for the students.

The themes and topics conducted in the camp are environmental awareness on care for the environment and care for the earth" activity.

The also have drama workshops by portraying the different stories and characters in the Gospel.

Most importantly is the Life Education session that led students to know, to value and to appreciate themselves.

It took almost two months for the volunteers-teachers to prepare their lessons and workshops. They also attended orientation to understand the charism of Caritas that is the core motivation of the volunteer program.

Most of the volunteer teachers have happy memories of the Summer Camp that contributed to their growth professionally and as persons.

Justice & Peace Work with the Migrants



Together with its network, the Migrants Empowerment Network in Taiwan (MENT), Caritas Taiwan continues to lobby for the protection of the migrant workers especially for the domestic workers' rights and welfare.

The recent amendments of the Labor Standards Law has called the attention of the migrant workers who bear the consequences of unfair calculation of over time pay and wages.

Motivated by the invitation of Share the Journey to listen to the stories of the migrants and refugees, some friends of Caritas Taiwan who heard about the plight and situation of the migrant workers extended their support especially to the women in the detention center by donating undergarments and food.

There are around 640,000 migrant workers in Taiwan that hails from Indonesia, Vietnam, Philippines and Thailand.

For more than 5 years, Taiwan ranks Tier 1 because of its anti trafficking in person prevention efforts.







The growing number of Vietnamese migrant workers in Taiwan has also increased the number of Vietnamese Catholic in parishes nearest to them. Local parishes that are frequented by Catholic migrants mostly Filipinos and Vietnamese, have Eucharistic celebration in their local language.


In Taipei, the Vietnamese community

celebrated the feast of the Vietnamese martyrs in St. Christopher's Church which was attended by Vietnamese from Kaoshiung and some other parts of Taiwan.

Caritas Taiwan has been collaborating with Fr. Tran Van Thiet and his team in their regular apostolate to the Vietnamese fishermen. For almost 2 years now, Caritas is soliciting winter clothes, cap or bonnet to be distributed to the fishermen who hardly have descent place to rest or sleep while they are on board.

In his Lenten Message, the Holy Father, Pope Francis particularly reminded us to rekindle the love of Christ by learning the life and examples of the saints.

The Pope also encourage the Eucharistic Adoration in the parish.

For the Lenten Campaign, Caritas Taiwan also promoted the local Camino de Santiago that is popularized in Spain as a way to have spiritual retreat.

There are suggested trails and organized pilgrimage for those who are interested.

The funds that were raised in the Lenten Campaign was distributed according to the needs of the Catholic institutions in the Dioceses of Taiwan. It was also apportioned to respond to the Emergency Appeals of CI and other Caritas partners and collaborators abroad.



The annual meeting of Caritas Dioceses was held on July 24-26, 2018 in Taipei. The meeting was graced by Caritas President, Bishop Philip Huang, Archbishop of Taipei Rev. Bishop John Hung and Fr. Willy Ollevier representing the Association of Religious Major Superiors.

Caritas Macau Director, Mr. Paul Pun was invited to share about best practices of Caritas Macau and how they overcome the different challenges until they reached what is Caritas Macau to date.

Each Diocesan Caritas also shared how they have progressed through the years by learning new things from their experiences and having set their own structure to function as Caritas. Sr. Emma Lee, the Director of Caritas Taiwan, expressed the willingness to accompany them to strengthen their programs and to manage the different challenges.

In the annual meeting, there was also the evaluation of project proposals that will be subsidized from the funds raise from the Lenten Campaign.

Canonization Caritas Patron Saints



The Church in Taiwan celebrated the canonization of Pope Paul VI and Oscar Romero (Archbishop of El Salvador) by publishing in the Catholic Weekly their respective life and work in the church.

Born Giovanni Battista Enrico Antonio Maria Montini on the 26th September 1897, Pope Paul VI led the Catholic Church from 1963 until his death on August 6, 1978.

Succeeding John XXIII, Paul VI continued the Second Vatican Council - which he closed in 1965 - implementing its numerous reforms.

Oscar Romero, who will become the first Salvadoran saint, was born on August 15, 1917. He was gunned down during Mass in a hospital chapel on March 24, 1980, a day after telling an army made up largely of peasants that they were killing their own people.

Pope Francis canonized them on October 14, 2018 in Rome.




